NTsafe EXPO - 3 June 2001

THE EVENT

This one-day event. hosted by the Police. Fire and Emergency Services will highlight the Northern Territory Government's crime prevention and community safety initiative **NT**safe.

NTsafe Expo will also provide a snapshot of the everyday operations of Police, Fire and Emergency Services (PFES), other Northern Territory Government agencies with crime prevention activities and some Commonwealth agencies, for example the Australian Customs Service.

The Expo will provide opportunities for the public to see exhibitions of emergency response personnel at work, including handling of weaponry and animals. It will include hands-on activities that will enable the public, particularly young people, to momentarily experience what it is like to be a member of the police force, a fire fighter or emergency services volunteer.

Darwin businesses will also be invited to take part and showcase their crime prevention and community safety products.


NTsafe Expo 2001 will be a celebration of the International Year of the Volunteer and will provide an opportunity for PFES associated volunteer organisations to raise funds. It will also mark the Centenary of Federation and celebrate the progress made by PFES in the past 100 years.

THE AIMS

The aims of the NTsafe Expo are to:

- Highlight the role of NTsafe in promoting crime prevention and community safety.
- Show the dedication and determination of personnel toward maintaining law and order.
- Advise the community on how they can help maintain a safe environment and quickly respond to emergency situations.
- Promote recruitment of staff and volunteers.
- Develop a better relationship with the public.
- A Highlight International Year of the Volunteer.
- Provide a fund raising opportunity for related non-profit oprganisations.
- Offer the private sector an opportunity to promote crime prevention and community safety products.
