After almost seven months of work, our first display was officially opened on Thursday 28 September by our Patron, Commissioner Brian Bates AM, APM.


Commissioner Bates congratulated the Museum Management Committee consisting of representatives from the Northern Territory Archives, the Museum & Art Gallery of the Northern Territory, the Northern Territory Police Association Inc and the Retired Police Association of the Northern Territory Inc. These groups, under the chairmanship of Bill Wilson have worked together to produce a quality display highlighting "The Tablelands".

The Hon Mike Reed, MLA, Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Services and The Hon Peter Adamson, MLA, Minister for Arts and Museums were present at the opening and have also congratulated the group.

It is envisaged that the display will continue to be housed in the foyer of the Peter McAulay Centre for approximately three months. The display will then be transported to Alice Springs, Tennant Creek, Borroloola and Katherine over the next 12 months before finally returning to Darwin.

Although only small in size, the display presentation has the quality of a professional exhibition.

The Management Committee are now working on their second exhibition.

LIFE AS A POLICEMAN'S SON

Our second General Meeting to be held at **7pm** on **1 November 2000** in the Theatrette, Police College, Berrimah will focus on "Life as a policeman's son".

Born on 27 September 1885, Mounted Constable John Creed "Jack" Lovegrove joined the Northern Territory Police on 1 October 1910.

He served in a number of locations around the Territory and eventually reached the rank of Inspector.

He was married on 31 July 1925. His children, Yvonne Lillian was born on 11 May 1926 and Thomas Creed (known as Creed) was born on 7 July 1927. Another son, Ian Hamilton was born on 16 December 1930. This completed the Lovegrove family.

Creed continues to live in Darwin and has advised of his availability to speak on his experience of "Life as a policeman's son" during the depression years and beyond.

The evening will commence with a screening

of the movie "Outback Patrol". This movie depicts the life of a Territory policeman and runs for approximately 20 minutes.

Tickets are available now and will remain at the same price as the last meeting – \$5.00 for members (NT Police Museum & Historical Society Inc) and \$8.00 for non-members.

We look forward to seeing you all once again at this forum.



A small taste of the First Display at the Peter McAulay Centre, Berrimah






CITATION
